

Grants & Development Contractor

Position Description

The Grants & Development contractor will be responsible for assisting in and supporting fundraising operations for Women Unite!. Women Unite! is a Chicagobased nonprofit that provides capacity-building services for free and on a sliding scale to a range of client organizations. This position will assist with the full range of fundraising and development activities for Women Unite!'s clients.

These activities include grant research, grant writing, and grant reporting with private foundations, corporations, and public agencies. Specifically, this individual is responsible for researching and identifying prospective funders, writing proposals for both unrestricted operating revenue and restricted programs, and submitting timely and accurate reports for all existing grant-funded projects. Additionally, this individual will be responsible for helping implement a variety of communications and fundraising projects including, but not limited to event promotion, annual giving campaigns, and donor cultivation and stewardship.

Candidates must possess excellent verbal and written communication skills, strong project management skills, a professional demeanor, the ability to work both independently and as a team player, and a desire to take initiative. Women Unite! is based in Chicago, but this position is fully remote. This individual will report directly to the <u>Executive Director</u> and the <u>Communications Manager</u>.

Qualifications

- 3-5 years of development experience and/or 1-3 years of grant writing experience
- Demonstrated experience in obtaining grants for nonprofits
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills required
- Strong interpersonal and presentation skills
- Experience with sourcing opportunities, contact development, and business relationship management
- Detail oriented, organized, and demonstrated ability to successfully manage multiple projects and tasks concurrently

Responsibilities

- Grants:
 - Research and identify grant opportunities based on funding amount needed, funding priorities, and organization program

- Communicate with foundations, if needed, to confirm organization's eligibility to apply for funding and area of best fit for funding
- Manage calendar of grant opportunities including deadlines, required materials, etc.
- o Complete and submit grant applications to secure funding
- Development:
 - Successfully understand and communicate client's mission and vision to external audiences
 - Assist with stewarding client's donors
 - Provide communications support for annual giving campaigns, events, and other fundraising and development projects for Women Unite!, its partners, and its clients

Hours: This is a remote, contract position. Women Unite! is a Results Only Work Environment, which means focus and performance evaluation is based on results and outputs.
